


Exodus 3:13-14 (ESV)







## Mark 15-7 (ESV)




### Luke 4 195-36 (ESV)





#### John 1138-40 (ESV)






### John 10.31-33 (ESV)

<sup>61</sup> But he remained silent and made no answer. Again the high priest asked him, "Are you the Christ, the Son of the Blessed?" 62 And Jesus said, "I am, and you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of Power, and coming with the clouds of heaven."



I am the greet oprevent anyone saying the really foolish thing that people often say about Him: 'I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept His claim to be God.' That is the one thing we must not say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic - on a level with the man who says he is a poached egg — or else he would be the Devil of Hell.
