- 1. What does it mean to become like children in verse 3? What is the difference between having childlike faith and being immature in your faith?
- 2. How does the requirement of humility in verses 1-4 compare with culture's view of greatness?
- 3. How does a biblical view of the church go against a culture that prizes independence?
- 4. Why is the practice of discipline and correction referred to in verses 15-20 so important in the local church? If this is not practiced what happens?
- 5. If I am not showing mercy and forgiveness to others, how might this be an indication that I am not being shaped by the Gospel? (Consider the following)

Don Carson commenting on Matthew 6:14–15 (ESV) For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

This "is not a sort of legalistic approach to God that is in view. Rather, it has to do with the heart and the attitude. If I am harboring a grudge against someone, am I really repenting of my own sin? If I am so busy being bitter to the person whom I can't forgive, how then have I repented, and how then will God forgive me?"
